# Political Theory in Times of Uncertainty

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Without exaggeration, uncertainty can be described as the signature of our time. Today, a multitude of crises and challenges confronts us with uncertainty in an often existential manner: from the climate crisis to the COVID pandemic, from the crises of neoliberal hegemony and liberal democracies to the recently re-emerging conflicts about the distribution of power in global society. Not only are possible solutions uncertain, but it is also impossible to anticipate which new crises and challenges may arise soon. This situation demands the reflection by political theory and the history of political ideas, as it brings political coping strategies to their limits and casts doubt on established narratives of modern political theory.

What is needed, therefore, is an open exploration of problems beyond well-rehearsed paradigmatic positions of contemporary political theory. Uncertainty is not only a pressing problem of our time, but a constant companion of the history of political thought – sometimes more and sometimes less so. Reflecting on the problems of our time therefore not only benefits from a synchronic look at the plural theoretical offerings of the present, but also necessitates a diachronic look at the vicissitudes of the history of political ideas.

Moreover, the uncertainty of the present is unquestionably a problem that cannot be approached solely through the perspective of political theory in a narrow sense: exploratory dialogues between political theory and other sub-disciplines of political science are therefore not only appealing, but indispensable. Beyond the disciplinary perspective of political science, it is essential to include other disciplines that push beyond the narrow viewpoint of Western thought from the outset: the uncertainties we are currently confronted with are mostly global problems, and they belong to a world which is itself characterized by massive inequalities, power asymmetries, conflicts, and epistemic dissonances that not only amplify the uncertainties and insecurities, but also constitute them in the first place. Our congress takes this complex and challenging situation as an opportunity to invite a joint reflection on the problem.


# During the Congress

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## Maps and Orientation



For details on how to get from one venue to the other see the illustrations below:




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**A:** ATLANTIC – Wiener Straße 4, 28359 Bremen

Bremen is a perfect city for biking, and you can easily rent a bike at one of the several *WK-bike* stations. Use the *WK* or *Nextbike* application to find the closest available bike in your surroundings. For holders of the *Deutschlandticket*, the first 30 minutes of bike rental are free. The usual prices are 1€ per 15 minutes.

If you come to the Congress venue by car, you can either use the parking facilities of the Atlantic Hotel (11€ / day) or one of the two parking facilities of the university (1€ / day), which are *University car park Bibliothekstraße* & *University car park Universitätsallee*. To get to the city centre, we recommend using the tram if possible, as parking there can be expensive. Nevertheless, there still are some car parks available in the centre in case public transport is not an option.

## Sights, Souvenirs and Shopping – The City centre

If you want to visit historical sites in Bremen, buy souvenirs for friends and family, or send a postcard, the city centre is where you get lucky. To reach the city centre from campus, hop on tram number six and get off at Domsheide. The ride takes about 20 minutes from there. Most places of interest are within a short walking distance.

The **SCHNOOR QUARTER** is one of Bremen's oldest parts, characterized by narrow streets, charming little craft shops, and artisanry. You can also find small restaurants and gift shops there.

Taking a walk along **SCHLACHTE** offers a beautiful view of the Weser River and some picturesque old ships along its bank.

For shopping opportunities, visit **OBERNSTRÄBE** or the adjacent **SÖGESTRÄBE**. Whether you're looking for clothes, souvenirs, or a supermarket, you'll find it all there.

## Bars, Cafés, restaurants – The Viertel

Take a stroll through the **VIERTEL** ("the quarter"), one of the most lively and bohemian quarters of Bremen. You'll find bars and cafes, pubs, and restaurants with various cuisines. If the weather is good, it is also recommended to grab a drink from one of the little shops and take a stroll along the Weser, which is right around the corner. To get to the Viertel, take Tram line 6 to the central station and transfer to Tram number 10 in the direction of Sebaldsbrück. If you get off at Sielwall, you'll be right in the beating heart of Bremen's nightlife. Below you find a few recommendations for cafes, bars, and restaurants.

**THEATRO** Restaurant and café at the Goethe Theatre. The menu offers fresh Mediterranean cuisine from tapas to pizza as well as a few vegan options.
