The Master's Degree in Transcultural Studies

The Master's Degree in Transcultural Studies (abbreviated as MATS): a four-semester long Master's in Transcultural Studies which has been offered at the University of Bremen since 2008 - a transdisciplinary programme in Anthropology and Cultural Studies, Religious Studies and Literature. Theory and practice are geared to a variety of careers spanning inter- and transcultural fields. MATS is a byword for contemporary Cultural Studies in modern societies.

Main Themes

We explore cultural exchange, intermixing and innovation, as well as various types of inequality and violence that have been shaped through history and power, and which surface in myriad forms around the world.

Modules, Learning Formats and International Exchange Programmes

How are studies organized?

MATS comprises four study semesters and 11 separate modules. The first semester provides a theoretical and practical overview. In the second semester the basics are deepened and methodological training with research-based tools is pursued. The third semester focuses on current fields of research about transculturalism. The fourth semester is mainly for drafting the Master's thesis, with a three-month time-frame for completing the process. Study abroad periods, language skills training and internships all allow students to enhance their study profile in line with future career goals.

Admittance Criteria

Who can enrol on the MATS course?

All B.A. graduates who focus on the analysis of cultures qualify for MATS e.g. Anthropology and Cultural Studies, Comparative Religious Studies, Social Sciences and Sociology, Modern Languages and Literature; but equally Social Work, Philosophy, as well as Art and Theatre Studies. Applicants will require English language skills at B2 level and a further foreign language at A2 level. In case of interest please submit your application:
